

Working together to deliver City Deal projects

Remembering Dr Tom Moran: Queen's Chancellor

The death of Queen's Chancellor Dr Thomas J Moran on Saturday 11 August was felt right across the University family, the Irish-American community and the business world.

Dr Moran spent most of his working life at Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, where he rose to the position of President and Chief Executive Officer. He was also Chairman of Concern Worldwide (US), Inc., an international humanitarian relief organisation that operates in 30 of the poorest countries of the world. Dr Moran became Chancellor of Queen's in May 2015.



Boost for Arts and Humanities

The Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC), has announced places for 335 postgraduate students, studying 28 different disciplines at UK universities which are part of the Northern Bridge Consortium.

Queen's graduates have until 10 January 2019 to apply for a Northern Bridge studentship. The places will be based at universities that are Northern Bridge Consortium members, which currently comprises Durham, Newcastle, Northumbria, Sunderland, Teesside and Ulster universities, along with Queen's.
