Born and educated in Scotland, he succeeds the late Professor Patrick Johnston, who died last June. Professor Greer will take up post on 1 August 2018.

Alumna named President of US College

Queen's languages graduate, Dr Lorraine Sterritt, is set to become the 17th President of Saint Michael's College in Colchester, Vermont.

Dr Sterritt, who formerly held senior positions in both Harvard and Princeton, has an MA in French (1986) and a BA in French and English (1983) from Queen's University, and will be the first woman to serve as President in the College's 114 year history.



Inspiring future astronauts

Jenny Lister, a 2006 Queen's Arts graduate (Stranmillis), is celebrating winning a prestigious award from the Royal Astronomical Society for her work inspiring primary school children in STEM subjects.

A primary school teacher in London, Jenny was awarded the RAS Patrick Moore Medal for her work with young people in science, technology, engineering and mathematics and for inspiring in them a love of space.



Remembering Dr Maurice Hayes

Few individuals have made such a wide-ranging contribution to local government, health, politics (in both Northern Ireland and the Republic), sport, culture and Queen's governance, as alumnus Dr Maurice Hayes, who died on 23 December 2017.

A former member of the University's Senate, he was awarded an LLD in 1971 and was President of the Queen's University Association, now the Queen's Graduates' Association, in 1999.
